- + Are somehow observable you can tell whether something is different and how that change affects the congregation and wider community.
- + Are inspiring and life-giving to the congregation and community.
- + Identify relationships needed to be formed or centered for the endeavor to be successful.
- + Honor the work that is already occurring around these issues by resisting the White Savior Complex.

The broad categories below are mere suggestions of places to start. You may want to name different areas to set goals around, and that is fine too.
